

NOTES, RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. Responsibility. The Organisers of this Show have taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and preventaccidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the Organisers and all the Officials and Stewards. The Society, its Officers or Servants or Agents shall not be responsible for any injury, damage or loss however caused to any animal, article or other property, belonging to the exhibitor and the exhibitor agrees to indemnify the Society in respect of any costs in connection with any claims made upon the Society as a result of the actions or omissions of the exhibitor or of any employee of the exhibitor.
 - Each exhibitor shall be solely responsible for any loss, injury or damage that may be done to, or occasioned by or arising from any animal, article or property exhibited or brought on to the Showground by him and he shall indemnify and hold harmless the Society from and against all actions, suits, expenses and claims on account of or in respect of any such damage or injury, which may be so caused or occasioned.
 - The Society, its Officers or Servants will not be liable for any errors or mistakes that may happen in placing, or penning the stock or articles to be exhibited but the servants in charge of the same must see that they are placed according to their entries. The Society expects all exhibitors to have had experience in display of livestock at Shows and all exhibitors should be aware of the distractions that can be caused to exhibits in their possession during the course of the event. At the steward's discretion, an animal can be prevented from showing if deemed to be a health and safety issue.
- 2. Attendants. Exhibitors or their attendants must remain with their exhibits during the whole time they are at the Show and must comply with and be governed by the Society's Rules and Regulations.
- 3. Bulls. All Bulls above twelve months old shall have rings or "bull-dogs" in their noses and be provided with leading sticks.
- **4. Judges**. The Judges named in the Society's Prize Schedule and the Show Catalogue or Programme have consented and have been appointed to act as Judges in the events indicated. The Committee reserves the right to appoint substitutes for any who may be unavoidably prevented from attending and all entries are accepted upon that understanding.
- 5. Judging. Judging will commence as near as circumstances allow, at the times stated in the Schedule under the respective sectional headings and exhibitors will be held responsible for their exhibits being in the Judging Ring at the proper time. The society reserves the right to amend the start time of judging dependent upon entries.
- 6. Illegal Use of Drugs & Sedatives. The Show will be co-operating with the National Cattle Breeders Association to discourage the illegal use of drugs and sedatives in cattle production. The Committee reserves the right to request a blood sample from any animal about which a Steward or Judge has suspicion of drugs being used to gain unfair advantage.
- 7. DNA Sampling. It should be noted that it is a condition of entry that exhibitors accept that the Society reserves the right to take DNA samples for analysis from the exhibit and dam and sire of same to verify cattle passport details. This will be undertaken by a veterinary surgeon nominated by the Society and the Samples will be tested by a recognised blood testing agency. Duplicate samples will be made available to the exhibitor for independent testing.
- 8. Objections. Should the right of any party to a prize awarded on the first day of the Show be disputed notice of the same must be given to the Secretary, in writing, not later than 12 noon on the succeeding day and to any award on the second day of the Show before 3pm in the afternoon of that day, or within seven days from the date of the Show, when the evidence to substantiate the protest cannot be obtained on the days of the Show. The person giving such notice must lodge the sum of £50 in the hands of the Secretary, as a guarantee that he will attend a meeting of the Society's Committee of which he will have notice and support his case. If he does not so attend the deposit of £50 will be forfeited to the Society. The £50 will b returned only if the objection is upheld. The decision of the Chief Steward will be final in the event of any objection raised on eligibility, judging, award and prizes and other related matters.
- 8. Stewards -
- a. At a Steward's discretion an animal can be prevented from showing if deemed to be a health and safety issue.
- Power to Enforce Regulations. The Committee delegates full power to the Stewards to enforce the Society's Rules and Regulations.
- c. The Current Chairman, Chief Steward and Chief Ring Steward of the English Winter Fair or National Calf Show are prohibited from exhibiting during their terms of office.
- 9. Interpretation of the Rules and Regulations. The Society reserves to itself by its Committee the sole and absolute right to interpret these Rules and Regulations or any other prescribed Conditions arbitrarily to settle and determine all matters, questions or differences in regard thereto, or otherwise arising out of or connected with or incidental to the Show. Also, to refuse or cancel any entries, to postpone or abandon the Show and relax conditions as the Society may deem expedient.
- 10. Exhibitors will be required to undertake to comply with any bio security Regulations that DEFRA may impose.
- 11. Fixing & Tampering. Any artificial contrivance or device of any description
 - found on or proved to have been used on an animal at any time whilst that animal is in the Showground for any improper purpose, will disqualify that animal from being awarded a prize, and any prize awarded prior to discovery will be forfeited. The Instigator or The Owner of the said animal may be prohibited from again entering Stock for any of the Society's Shows, for such period as the Committee may see fit. For the purpose of this Regulation, the term 'improper practice' shall be held to include any practice including tampering of their own or any other animal by the exhibitor or any other person which results in the animals being shown other than in a natural state, and the Society reserves the right to have all animals inspected by the Society's Veterinary Officers, either prior to, during, or after judging. The Society will not tolerate the administration to show exhibits (entered either for competition or sale/demonstration) of tranquillisers or other drugs which may in any way affect the performance of the animal in question to have the effect of making it behave in the show ring in a manner which is not natural. The Society reserves the right to take any necessary samples from any animal about which a Steward or Judge has suspicion of drugs being used to gain unfair advantage. Any Person or Exhibitor (or his representative) who is found to have administered or permitted the administration of any such tranquilliser or drugs to any Show exhibit will be reported to the Organising Committee and dealt with at their discretion. In addition, the matter will be referred to the appropriate Breed Society or Organisation.



SHOWGROUND HOLDING NUMBER - 37/197/8001-01

The English Winter Fair is held in Bingley Hall, the Sandylands Centre and the Argyle Centre at the Staffordshire County Showground, Weston Road, Stafford. These are purpose-built exhibition halls where the whole of the Show is held under cover in heated buildings. The carcass section is held in the specially refrigerated and enclosed Michael Bradshaw Memorial Hall adjacent to the main exhibition area. The Showground is sited approximately 5 miles from Junction 14 of the M6 Motorway and 3 miles from Stafford town centre.

There is no purpose-built stockpersons accommodation on the Showground although stockpersons can be accommodated in the Margaret Everton Pavilion adjacent to Bingley Hall providing they bring their own camp bed and bedding. Toilets and washing facilities are available in Bingley Hall. There is limited caravan parking space at the Showground and a permit will be required which must be obtained in advance of the show by application on the entry form. Caravans must be parked as directed by the stewards.

Please note dogs are not permitted within the buildings except for assistance dogs.



The Showground is positioned on the A518 Stafford to Uttoxeter road fifteen minutes drive from both Junction 14 of the M6 Motorway and Stafford Railway Station. Two major airports, Birmingham and Manchester, can be accessed in under one hour.



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CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- ENTRY CLOSING DATES The closing date for Livestock and Carcase entries is 16th October 2019. The closing
 date for the Poultry Classes and The Royal Smithfield Ribs of Beef and Saddle of Lamb Competitions will be 13th
 November 2019, (entries received after 1st November will not be included in the catalogue). Moreover, all entries must
 be accompanied by the full entry fees.
- Cattle passports must be brought to the Show with all animals and where applicable will be required for inspection, prior to weighing.
- 3. In Sections 1, 2 and 3 (Beef cattle), where there are less than 4 entries in a class or less than 3 exhibitor's entries will be amalgamated to a heifer and steer if appropriate or transferred to Any Other Continental/Native Breed class as appropriate. Once the above transfers have been made, should there still be insufficient entries in the any other Continental/Native pedigree class the entries will be transferred to its relevant crossbred class in accordance with its breed. Should the class in question have the sponsorship of a Breed Society this rule will not apply. In relation to the Pedigree Calf Section where there are less than 4 entries in a class or less than 3 exhibitors the class will be amalgamated e.g. senior and junior bull calves etc. Should the class in question have the sponsorship of a Breed Society this rule will not apply. In the Any Other Continental/Native Breed classes in the Beef & Calf sections, if a class has more than 12 exhibits of which at least 6 are one breed, that breed will be transferred into a separate class for that breed. In the Sheep Section, there must be a minimum of 2 exhibitors with at least 3 entries between them for any class to stand. If there are four exhibitors or more of the same breed in the Any Other Mountain Breed, Any Other Native Breed or Any Other Continental Breed Classes, they shall be transferred to a separate class for that breed. In the Pig Section, there must be a minimum of 2 exhibitors for any class to stand.
- 4. Animals in Section 1 and Section 5 must be registered with the relevant Breed Society. Complete details of pedigree, name of breeder and date of birth, must be shown on the entry, and animals should bear an identification mark in compliance with their respective breed society regulations. The Society may check breeding details with the Breed Society.
- 5. For entries in Sections 2 and 3 (Non-Pedigree) the breed or cross of the animal MUST be clearly stated. No entries will be accepted without these details. The Society also asks all exhibitors to give a name to their exhibits and to state this on the entry form, together with the ear number.
- Animals in the crossbred cattle sections must be entered in the class in accordance with the breed of the sire as stated on the passport. All animals must be from a pedigree sire.
- 7. No animal may be entered or shown in more than one class (excluding live pig section) nor may an animal be transferred from one class or Section to another without the permission of the Society's stewards. Transfer of animals will be permitted from the Baby Beef classes in the event an animal is overweight to be shown in these classes on arrival at the Show. That animal will be transferred to its respective breed class. Animals entered in breed classes will not be eligible for transfer to the Baby Beef classes.
- 8. All cattle must be double tied in their stalls. In addition, cattle must be halter led. Big Jims will not be allowed.
- 9. Current TB regulations in regard to Shows must be complied with.
- 10. All live sheep MUST have electronic identification fitted in order to be shown at the Show. ARAM forms must be completed correctly prior to arrival at the show.
- 11. Pig movements to the show must be pre-notified via the electronic pig movement licensing system ('eAML2') and A COPY OF THE 'ON' MOVEMENT MUST BE HANDED TO A STEWARD ON ARRIVAL AT THE SHOW. Copies of the new haulier summary movement document, which must accompany pigs throughout the journey to the show and their return journey, can be obtained from the 'eAML2' system directly when pre-notifying the move online on www.eaml2.org.uk or alternatively from the eAML2 Bureau Service, which will pre-notify the movement onto the 'eAML2' system on the exhibitor's behalf, and then send the appropriate number of copies of the Haulier Summary document to accompany the animals in transit. Any pigs sold at the Show will be required to fill in a report of a Show sale movement form, recording the on-movement reference from the seller in the 'Sale Reference' box.
- 12. NO SUCKLER COWS OR ANY OTHER CATTLE NOT ENTERED TO BE SHOWN WILL BE ALLOWED ONTO THE SHOWGROUND. Any exhibitor infringing this Regulation will be expelled from the show with immediate effect.
- 13. **Electrical Safety** Exhibitors are reminded that all electrical equipment brought on to the Showground must have a safety certificate issued by a qualified electrician. Furthermore, attention should be paid to the correct wiring of portable electrical equipment and that insulation material on extension leads is not damaged. No electrical equipment is to be used in the washing area.
- 14. All exhibitors must hold a minimum of £2.5million indemnity for public liability insurance.
- 15. Appointed English Winter Fair judges will not be allowed to enter any live animal section of the English Winter Fair in the year in which they are judging. Equally judges appointed to judge the National Pedigree Calf Show cannot enter in any section of the National Pedigree Calf Show
- 16. No Pressure washers or other electrical equipment is to be used in the cattle washing area. Accordingly, exhibitors are only to use the washing equipment provided by the Society in this area.

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

The 4th prize will only be awarded when there are at least 8 entries forward The 5th prize will only be awarded when there are at least 10 entries forward In classes where there is only one entry forward, 2nd prize money only will be awarded

In the Pig Section:

The 1st prize will only be awarded where there are at least 2 entries forward. The 2nd prize will only be awarded where there are at least 3 entries forward. The 3rd prize will only be awarded where there are at least 4 entries forward.

Payment of National Pedigree Calf show prize money **ONLY** will be made by the Society between 3.30pm – 4.00pm on the Saturday afternoon of the show, from the cashier's office in Bingley Hall. All other prize money payments will be made by the Society between 3.15pm and 4.00pm on the Sunday afternoon of the Show, on receipt of prize vouchers, from the cashier's office in Bingley Hall. With the exception of major prizes over £300 all prize money will be paid in cash. Any prize money not claimed on the day will be sent by cheque after the Show.

Trophies awarded will be held by the exhibitor for one year, during which time the exhibitor will have total liability for the safety of the trophy and will be liable to insure the trophy against loss or damage. Exhibitors may have the trophy engraved at their own expense if so wished, but it must be in the same style and font size as the existing list of winners. Exhibitors are asked to ensure that trophies are returned in good time for representation at the next year's Show to avoid disappointment to other exhibitors.

ACCOMMODATION IN BINGLEY HALL In order to comply with bio security and veterinary inspection regulations the times livestock will be permitted to enter the site as laid down in the exhibitor's pack must be adhered to.

ENGLISH WINTER FAIR ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE OF LIVESTOCK. Livestock may arrive from 7am on Friday 15th November and will not be allowed to leave before 3.30pm on Sunday 18th November.

NATIONAL PEDIGREE CALF SHOW ARRIVALAND DEPARTURE. Livestock may arrive from 7am up to 10pm on Friday 15th November or between 6am and 8am on Saturday 16th November. Livestock entered in the **Pedigree Calves Classes ONLY** may leave at approximately 4pm, following the Pedigree Calf Championships on Saturday 16th November.

Weighing will take place on Friday 15th November of all animals entered in the English Winter Fair – cattle between 1.00pm and 4.00pm, sheep between 11.30am and 3.00pm and pigs between 3.00pm and 4.00pm. All weighing must be completed by 4.30pm at the very latest. Entries in the Pedigree Calf Show will not be weighed but will need to arrive by 10.00pm on Friday 15th November or between 6am & 8 am Saturday 16th November. Passports for these animals will be checked by Stewards as they arrive.

PLEASE ENSURE PASSPORTS ARE MADE AVAILABLE AT THE WEIGH IN. The Chief Steward and Deputy Chief Steward will be present at the weighing of the cattle. In the event of there being any doubt about the eligibility of the animal for the class in which it has been entered, their opinion will be final. Moreover, if they believe that the animal is not of the breed or cross stated, they retain the power to transfer the animal to the correct class.

INFORMATION ON DEFRA REGULATIONS APPLYING AT THE TIME OF THE SHOW WILL BE SENT TO EXHIBITORS WITH THEIR PASSES PACK.

Availability of Straw

The Society has made arrangements to supply small bales of straw to exhibitors at a cost of £4.00 per bale which MUST be ordered on the entry form at time of entry of classes. Vouchers will be sent to exhibitors in the pre-show exhibitors pack which can be exchanged at the show on Friday 15th November between the hours of 7am and 5pm for the bales of straw.




